

## A PETAL Paragraph

**Point** - Begin your paragraph with a sentence that responds to the question.

**Evidence** - Blend a quotation from the text into your writing. You can do this by using sentences like 'This is shown when...' or 'John Boyne writes...'

**Technique** - This is when you specify what technique the writer has used. This might be a particular verb or adjective, or it might be imagery or emotive vocabulary or alliteration.

**Analysis** - Consider the effect of this technique on the reader. Ask yourself what the writer intended by using it.

**Link** - Create a link back to the main question.

### **How is the Brocket family initially presented?**

At the start of the novel, John Boyne presents Mr and Mrs Brocket as cowards who are scared of anything that isn't normal. This is shown when Boyne describes the Brockets as "two people who were so afraid of anyone who was different that they did a terrible thing that would have the most appalling consequences". Boyne uses absolute language when he writes "anyone" to show that the Brockets discriminated against all those who didn't fit into their category of normality. In addition, the adjective "appalling" demonstrates that this prejudice has very negative outcomes for the Brocket family. Therefore, John Boyne initially presents the family as very prejudiced people, but that their prejudice is born out of fear.

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
